

The treasurer's report was not available.

The STO PAX discussion tabled from the last meeting was discussed and decision made for Rocky to contact PAX administrator Rick Ruth before next season and reevaluate STO PAX indices.

Rocky presented the corrected emergency plan and has posted it in the trailer. Updates included a corrected fire station address.

The printed car numbers were well received and used by some competing Sunday.

Kale Morris has accepted the position of Chief of Tech with the qualification that he may not be able to attend all events.

The July 21 event has been rescheduled to July 28 at Yoder and will be the Wichita Region round of the RE. challenge. It is also the July Salina Region points event.

THE COURSE TO COME

The first episode of Game of Thrones season 5 was "The Wars To Come." For autocrossers the wars to come are the challenges presented by a neverbefore-seen (usually) course. On this sunny Sunday, 25 drivers took on a course drawn by Brian Tefft Jr. which in some places demanded an aggressive attack, others a conservative approach. It was easy to carry the attack a bit too far.

Brian also dominated the event, scoring both FTD and Top PAX with a 51.155 run in his ES-winning Mister Two (he had a 50.7 but coned it). He was one of only four drivers below 53! Second-quick was Timothy Thompson's DS Focus, just 0.038 ahead of Tyler Naden's STO4 Miata. The only driver in the 52s was John LaRandeau's FS Mustang. Leading the rest of the pack with the quickest of the 53s was Monte Rans' HS Mini. Fast Lady was Sharon Brillhart's ESL Miata at 54.107.

Closest battle was a family feud in STO6 – first car out, the BMW Z3 shared by Brian Hardeman (another Brian!) and Trenton Kent-Hardeman. Brian led all the way in STO6 but never comfortably. After three runs his lead was one sec. Then they both ran high 59s, then both low 59s, and they finished with 58-sec runs with Brian 0.553 ahead.



# How to find your way to Yoder

From Salina go south on I-135, then K-61 (second McPherson exit) to Hutchinson. At the outskirts of Hutch take a sharp left at 17th Street (there's a traffic light) onto Airport Road, which bends south and eventually becomes Yoder Road. Go about six miles, then right on Red Rock Road through Yoder about 2¼ miles to what looks like a country driveway on the left. That's the site entrance. It's gravel until you reach the end of the old runway. Please respect the 10 mph speed limit past the owners home. There may be children present.

As I sit here putting this newsletter together, it's almost 11 pm Monday night, July 1. Registration for the Solo Nationals re-opened five hours ago. As of right now there are 28 spaces left. The entry this year is capped at 1325 drivers.

A week ago the "Tier 2" entry officially opened, but when the entry reached exactly 400 (plus 3 junior

karts) the MotorsportsReg system crashed. It can happen when nearly 1000 hopefuls try to access a site at the same moment.

"Tier 1," if you're curious, was an early entry for event chiefs, key officials, last year's champions and runners-up, and members of the Silver Circle (those who have run at least 25 Nationals). About 200 total.

I got my brother in about 7 pm. He's on the road and can't get to a computer tonight. Good thing, because we're driving his car this year. When I got him signed in the entry was already past 1100 – leaving fewer places than was the total entry for the first Solo Nationals (it was Solo II then) in 1973 at Mid-America Raceway, Wentzville, Mo. (224 cars).


Today's autocrossers probably could not imagine a Nationals like that one. They'd bring out the torches and pitchforks. Imagine a gravel paddock! Imagine a course on a narrow racetrack that only permitted slaloms. Imagine an afterthought second course that ran about 30 seconds! Imagine just 15 classes! Imagine all the female drivers in one Ladies class, indexed against the "men's class" top times.

But viewing a 1973 event through a 2019 prism carries the same flaw as assessing anything historic by the standards of modern times. We learn things. We do things better next time. And after 46 years of next times we've figured out how to do this thing really well.

In 1973 the largest class was C Stock, 20 cars, won by a Porsche 914 with a trio of Datsun 240Zs chasing. This year, so far, the largest classes – Open and Ladies combined – are A Street and D Street at 72 cars each. Not one Street or Street Touring class has fewer than the largest class of 1973.

In 1973 my ride was a 1971 Ford Pinto, first car I ever bought new, which I had "converted" into a racecar while it was still my daily driver. SCCA had invented the Showroom Stock category for road racing in 1972 (which has since morphed into Touring and Super Touring), and the Pinto in my driveway just happened to match the specs. Slap in a rollbar, 5-point harness and fire bottle and it was a racecar.

At the '73 Solo Nationals I was 9th out of 18 in G Stock. I might have done better but I bogged the start on both runs. Yes both. Things got so behind schedule we only got two runs on the long course.



learned, made mistakes, fixed them, made new ones. We grew from a weekend two-day event to a brief spate with a 3-day format – run one course in the morning, the other in the afternoon – to what is now a four-day extravaganza. Five days if you count the Monday devoted to coursewalking, eight when you add in the ProSolo Finale. The Nationals' run days could conceivably grow to six days if they need to accommodate an even larger entry.

Nationals came to Salina in 1975 at our East Crawford site – called Airport Park then, just an empty slab of concrete. No ballyards. No Markley Road. The event ran there six times, then nine more at the Municipal Airport on the west side of town in front of the Big Bertha hangar.

After 15 years here, with an entry now beyond 700, the Nationals outgrew Salina, went to Topeka for 14 years, then to Lincoln. Salina still holds the record for most Nationals. There's no reason not to expect Lincoln will match it in 2023 one year after the 50th Anniversary event.

It's midnight now and I'm done with this column. The 2019 Solo Nationals entry is at 1305. Somebody is going to wake up in the morning and find those last 20 entry slots are gone! Probably a lot of somebodys.
