



## PAX 2025 – Street classes spread farther apart

Drivers in the faster Street classes will have to push harder to find a good PAX score in 2025, while those in the three slower (on paper) classes will find help on the 2025 PAX index.

Which means, nationwide the upper classes were dominating last year while the ES, GS and HS classes weren't. Never mind what of any index.

Of the 10 classes in Street Prepared and Street Modified, only CSP and SSM saw a 1-point drop. Rick includes the ASP and BSP classes in his chart although neither has been officially included in SCCA's class listings since 2023.

year while the ES, GS was happening here in Middle America with folks like Ron Williams, Theresa Walton, and Russell and Laney Blume.

Those unicorns were not enough to swing the nationwide trends from more than 800 events charted by Rick Ruth in compiling his annual performance index. He calls it the RTP – "Racers' Theoretical Performance," -- but everyone knows it as PAX.

Rick has the chops to figure this. He's been autocrossing more than half a century and is one of, now, five

The same is true of the Heritage Classic category, which SCCA no longer includes on its website rulebook page but which enjoys participation at many local events. The HCS (Street) index dropped 4 points while HCR (Race) went down 1.

The largest bump in index was dealt to the C Prepared class, "The Heavy Metal class," as it terms itself. The raceprepped pony car class, which still annually enjoys the largest turnout at Nationals of any of the P classes. CP was bumped 7 points, and the XP class went

individuals who have competed in every one of the 51 SCCA National Solo Championship.

In the nine Street classes, ES, GS and HS all saw their index drop 2 points – ES, for example, from 0.792 to 0.790 – while SS, BS and DS all went up 1 point, AS rose 2 points and FS climbed 3 points. The CS index did not change.

Over the 52 classes listed, a dozen were hit with a higher index from their 2024 mark, while 19 saw their PAX drop. 21 held fast to their previous levels (or were new listings).

The chart also shows the re-naming of the now seven Street Touring classes with five of them enjoying a drop in their indices. The only unchanged name is SST – Super Street Touring, which enjoys a 4-point drop in its index. AST is a new class. After that we now have lettered classes emulating the pattern of all the other categories (except CAM and Heritage). BST is the former Street Touring Ultra, followed by CST (Roadster), DST (Xtreme), EST (Sport) and FST (Hatch). The bottom four all went down 1 or 2 points.

The Classic American Muscle classes also got help. CAM-Sport got a 4-point drop while both CAM-Contemporary and CAM-Traditional fell 1 point each.

With a year of data to work from, Rick apparently determined his ranks for the two new Club Spec classes were overly ambitious. Both CSX (NC Miatas) and CSM (2005-09 S197 Mustangs) saw their PAX tumble 8 points, the deepest drops of any class. Similarly, the other pure spec class, Solo Spec Coupe, went down 3 points.

Conversely, the Xtreme category went largely the other direction. While the XU (Unlimited, formerly XS) index did not change, XA went up 2 points as XB went down a point, bringing the two classes closer together but the smaller XB cars are still the quicker on index. Electric Vehicles were bumped 5 points, the second-highest increase up 3 points. All the other P classes remained unchanged, including BP which has not been in the rulebook since 2006.

A similar fate befalls the Modified classes. Both of the Mod category doorslammer classes – DM and EM – got an index bump of 2 points. CM, mostly Formula F cars (1600 cc Ford and 1500 cc Fit motors, plus Solo Vees) went up 1 point. All the other Mods from the baseline A Mod (index 1.000) down to the KM karts were unchanged.

2024 turned out to be another year of autocross participation sufficient to make me F Street Regional Champion again in my 2005 Nissan 350Z even though

I had very little competition. Most notably Adam Perney who after about 20 years of no autocrossing edged me in my own car.

But most fun has been my return to H Street with inappropriate cars. First there was the humble 2020 Chevy Bolt that could squeal its EV fuel efficiency tires almost the entire length of the course and managed to be not the slowest car in the event. Second was my first and so far only Bring A Trailer Auction purchase – the 2012 Fiat 500 Abarth with only 36,000 miles.

High point of that adventure was when I let Aaron Loggan co-drive in our rainy September event and he proceeded to pull off the FTD of the 26 drivers present. I, on the other hand, finished last in HS that day and the remaining events of the year. But, due to the generous nature of our season scoring system, those events plus

the one in the Bolt are sufficient to give me 3rd place in that class.

Now 2025 is unfolding before us. I will initially proceed to campaign the Fiat 500. Maybe the whole season. I still need to be disposing of my lifetime collection of stuff, starting with the 2005 350Z – 35th Anniversary Model. Sold in Salina in 2006, used little by first owner, a local businesswoman who sold it to me in 2022. It still has under 14,000 miles! 2 seasons autocross and one road trip to Colorado in the past two years. Practically perfect, with a set of 200 treadwear summer ultra performance tires mounted and set of all season tires included with 2019 date codes. Text me at 785-822-8570 if interested.

Back in the day when I was writing this column every month, I would do a Christmas wish list every December. Now all the coolest cars are outrageously expensive and most of the "affordable" – which means under \$60,000 – are dull and boring. So, my new year wish list is minimal.

• Number 2 would be a Mustang Mach-E, as soon as used ones drop below \$25,000.

• Number 3, Hyundai Ioniq 5, just because of the appropriate electric age styling and the fact that long time SCCA member, Randy Pobst, set a new production car record last summer at Pikes Peak in a nearly stock N version of the Ioniq 5! I remember long ago that there were two Solo Nationals, in Salina,

• Number 5, just because no one has seen fit to autocross one, but I and Aaron Loggan would, a current model Prius, because it finally is quick enough to be fun, and stylish enough to be a pleasing daily driver.

• And finally, I must admit that I am intrigued with the 2025 Dodge Charger EV with it's brash "Save the World" commercial that starts sounding like an environmentally responsibility pledge and instead is a tire burning offer to save us from soulless, self-driving saneness, or some such phrase, complete with muscle car sound effects, in addition to actual tire shredding torque and horsepower. It will not likely be the only absurdity of the coming New Year!
