PAX Index Updates

In the January issue of *The Write Line* we published the 2025 PAX/RTP index, which included the renamed Street Touring classes and a few new classes. Since then, PAX administrator Rick Ruth has collected new data leading to four classes getting new index numbers:

• CSX is bumped to 0.812 (former 0.803, Club Spec Mustang)

• SSC is bumped to 0.809 (former 0.802, Solo Spec Coupe)

• SST is bumped to 0.837 (former 0.832, Super Street Touring)

• EM is bumped to 0.916 (former 0.912, E Modified)

So far this season, of the four classes only two drivers in the SSC/SSCL classes are directly affected, Jimmy Green and Marcia Haynes, plus AS driver Chandler Brown, at our first event.

Jimmy's PAX was boosted from 42.612 to 42.984, Marcia's from 43.575 to 43.955. It did not change Jimmy's PAX ranking (3rd) at the "Lone Cone" event, while Marcia dropped from 6th to 7th, lifting Chandler Brown to 6th.

Easy path to a Divisional Championship (maybe)

The Midwest Division Solo Series begins in two weeks. This year the path to a championship might be a bit easier for Salina Region drivers.

By which I don't mean the competition will be easier. That may be true, or not, depending on your class. Rather, the literal path. The opening event is just an hour down the

highway, and the second round is right here in Salina. Just one day of each event meets the minimum qualification. After that, you get to count your best six events. Some classes, of course, are tougher than others. Let's look at some of the details:

The schedule this year is five 2-day weekends. Each day is a single event. Minimum participation requirement is two weekends. The maximum of six events can be done in three weekends. Such as:

Wichita Region's opening round May 3-4 in Yoder, then June 7-8 in Salina. Shazam! You're qualified, even if you only ran one day at each one.

Registration is open now for both events on MotorsportsReg.com. But if you're in contention maybe you want one more weekend to try for the maximum points.

Two more weekends are just 3½ hours away – either Nebraska Region's turn Aug. 2-3, usually running last year's Solo Nationals courses. Or the finale Sept. 20-21 at the Independence-Freedom Airport in Independence, KS by Kansas Region. The town has wonderful hospitality and a great site.

A little more distant is Davis Field in Muskogee, OK, the

June 28-29 event by Northeast Oklahoma Region. It's about a 5-hour drive but all on Interstates or Turnpikes (if you have a Kansas Turnpike K-TAG it works on the Cimarron Turnpike.)

As mentioned above, each day at a Divisional weekend is a separate event. Winners get 15 points, then 12, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, and 10th and below all get 3 points. Even if you have a

really bad day and DNF every run, you still get 3.

More information, including series rules, schedule, points standings, etc.,

may be found on the Midwest Division website, <u>www.midiv.org</u>. Look under "Programs."

The series is co-sponsored by Solo Performance Specialties, St. Louis, MO, and R&S Racing, Winterset, IA. Both provide services for racers including tires and performance parts.

Don't be thinking you're not "good enough." Anyone with that mindset never will be. Do you have fun autocrossing? Then you're good enough. But you can be better. We all can.

It is an oft-spoken aphorism that "to be the best you gotta beat the best." Sometimes it's "to get better race against someone better. "Or maybe just simply, "nothin' beats seat time." It is equally true that experience on

different courses, different pavements, different weather conditions, different organizations also makes you a better driver.

There's no One Right Way to draw an autocross course or to drive an autocross course. The more versatile you are, the more adaptable you are, the better you are.

Eight Across the O

Eight runs on a figure-8 course by Andlee Phengphachanh, and Andlee didn't even get to run it. His son's baseball game takes precedence. Priorities!

The setup also meant eight slaloms per run on the south end of our BFRA site while our annual Evolution Schools were running on the north end for students who came from Indiana, Colorado, Missouri, Oklahoma, Topeka, and last-minute students from Wichita and Salina.

Although only 19 entries showed for the Saturday contest, it produced three battles decided by less than one second separation. 53 pylons were dead on the day for an average of 2^{3} /4 pylons per driver. Oh, the plasticity!

Only CAM·C winner Steve Schrag made it through eight runs without penalty or DNF. In A Street, Chandler Brown's Lotus Elise and newcomer Kevin Omo from Wamego in a Z06 traded pylons and DNFs back and forth – for Chandler four DNFs and one more cone, for Kevin one DNF and four cones until Kevin finally got a clean 58.1 on his seventh lap and Chandler posted an equally shiny 58.0. But with one lap to go, Kevin found 57.5 while Chandler collected his final DNF. Kevin had a 0.513 sec MOV for the win.

In E Street's Miata mayhem Jason Rash started at 64.5 and whittled off another second before Rocky Entriken appeared from shepherding the Evo School to post an opening 63.1. Jason's Lap 8 was 61.064. Rocky completed his last three runs in the second heat, getting down to 61.755, but could not improve it. Jason's time held up for a 0.691 sec victory.

The third close one was in H Street between Don Herrick's Fiesta and the Mini Cooper of Dennis Smith, who also had to break away from working the Evo School as safety steward. Dennis got down to 62.189 on his fourth try, but Don found a 61.253 on his sixth run to take the class by 0.936 sec.

FTD and Top PAX were both claimed by Mason Libby's Saturn Sky, 56.287 sec. Sharon Brillhart claimed Fast Lady at 58.588

Watch yer six 🋩

Sunday's course was essentially Saturday's in reverse direction. Only six runs this time. Most of the 23 drivers, of those who ran both days, said it flowed better, but at 64 pylons knocked down the average cone count remained at 2³/₄ per driver.

And again, only one driver got through the day clean, this time HSL winner Nancy Smith, and the day only produced one contest decided by less than a second.

That was CAM·C, where Ethan Gibbs arrived to give chase to Steve Schrag. In raw time, Ethan was quickest but that run carried three cones and he could never get within a half-sec again, his best a 60.2. Schrag finally broke 60 on his last two runs, a cone hid his best one but second-best was 59.7 - good enough to win by 0.449 sec.

Sharon Brillhart swept the honors, FTD, FL and Top PAX.



The Write Line

One of the things I love about SCCA Autocross is the extremely low barrier to entry. Do you have a car? I do! Do you crave adrenaline? For sure! Then let's go play with cars! It's literally that simple.

Autocross allows anyone the opportunity to find the extreme limits of their vehicle around a coned course in a very controlled environment. Yes, you *can* slide your car around a corner with a smile on your face and Johnny Law actually can't turn on that dreaded red light. In fact, police officers have been known to participate.

Even though the barrier to entry for autocross is about as low as it gets for motorsports, there are a few items every autocrosser

can use as they head to their favorite parking lot or airport runway to compete. This list is by no means allencompassing, but what's on it will help you survive your weekend of #funwithcars.

1. Helmet — SCCA's Solo Rules require that every driver (and passenger) utilize a helmet that holds an approved safety rating. For most, that means a helmet meeting Snell requirements, which right now means a 2010 rated helmet or newer.

What's a Snell rating? It's a certification from the Snell Memorial Foundation that tests the viability of crash helmets. You'll find a small Snell sticker with a year (the ratings come out every five years, so 2010, 2015, 2020, and so on) placed on the inside of a rated helmet. For SCCA Autocross, most people will utilize a Snell "M" or "SA" helmet. "M" rated helmets (generally used for motorcycles) are usually less expensive than "SA." An "SA" (Special Application) rating is used for road racing, but is also allowed for autocross. [*Ed: The "K" rating (Karts) also works. It's identical to SA except it lacks the fire-resistant quality.*]

For those new to the sport, don't be frightened by the requirement of a helmet. In the 30 years I've been playing in parking lots, I've seen more helmets age out than be damaged – and those incidents where a helmet *is* damaged were usually caused by the helmet rolling off a vehicle or toolbox in the paddock and hitting the ground. In other words, treat your helmet with care and it'll last you a long, long time.

[Ed: The next generation 2025 Snell rating comes out in October. 2010 helmets will expire next year, December 2026. If you are new to the sport you might be better off using loaners until 2026 helmets are available.]

2. Tire gauge — The most important part of a car (besides the nut behind the wheel) is the tires. Those round rubber donuts are the only thing between your car and the racing surface that you'll be using to accelerate, brake, and turn. They're also the best performance modification you can make. It's little hyperbole to say that tires are everything.

Since tires are vital to success, it's crucial that the air pressure in those tires is optimized for performance. Too little air, the tire can de-bead from the rim. Too much air and the car will slide around and feel skittish. What's the right pressure for your car? There's no simple answer for that – but to consistently maintain that correct tire pressure once you find it, you need a tire gauge.

A simple pen gauge will work, but a nicer dial gauge with a bleeder valve will make adjustments between runs much simpler, and be more accurate. A portable electronic air pump is also extremely handy to have in case you find the need to add air. [*Ed*:

Or a portable air tank, which is quicker.]

3. Car numbers/class (or painter's tape) — Autocross is a competition (hence the adrenaline), which means the folks in the timing trailer needs to know which car is on course in order to log your official time.

Stickers or magnetic numbers and class designation (minimum eight inches tall for the car numbers and four inches tall for the class) help the folks running the event keep track of everything. But, if you don't have fancy magnetic numbers, simple painter's tape and some moderate artistic ability can get the job done.

Painter's tape will not hurt the finish of your car, although when event photos come out online of you exiting a corner with the tail

out, you'll probably wish you upgraded the tape for some sharp looking magnetic numbers so you look more like Max Verstappen.

> It's also notable that for some Regional autocross events, the organizers will supply numbers printed on paper that you then tape to the side of your car – in which case, you'll need painter's tape anyway. [*Ed: Salina Region provides both paper numbers and /letters, and painter's tape to attach them to your car. And we'd prefer you use them.*]

4. Sunscreen, hat, umbrella ... and yes, shoes — Because Solo events are held in large parking lots or

airport runways, there's generally little to no shelter, which means you need to bring your own shelter with you. Whether it's raining or shining, you should probably bring a good hat and an umbrella – plan on packing sunscreen for sunny events and a rain jacket when it'll be damp.

The reason autocross events are so affordable (in many cases, around \$50 for a day of fun) is because it's a work/race format. You get to drive around the course fast while (hopefully not) smacking cones – *and* you get to stand on course while other people drive around fast and you pick up their knocked-over cones. Consequently, there's a decent amount of time spent on your feet, so wear good shoes (per rules, shoes must cover the entire foot).

5. Snacks and water — Autocrosses are rarely held in the hustle and bustle of a shopping strip any more. They're held at the kind of places that don't mind if we drive cars around cones like maniacs. That is to say, fast food is usually not nearby. Autocross events are also porta-potty land (speaking of which, bring hand sanitizer just to be safe).

These events don't usually have a long enough break for you to leave to grab a meal at a Michelin-rated restaurant. Or even Mickey D's. So bring a small cooler with snacks and a meal to help get you through the day without getting hangry and wanting to chew off your own arm.

I'm by no means a nutritionist, so don't look to me for dietary advice. Apples and bananas? That's probably not a bad idea – but keep in mind that the person offering this advice starts every one of his competition weekends with doughnuts.

For water, a rule of thumb for hikers is to bring one liter for every two hours on the trail. Extrapolate that to an autocross, and packing a gallon of water is likely a good idea. [*Ed: Salina Region usually provides bottled water for workers and competitors*.]
