MEETING MINUTES

(Subject to correction and approval at the next Salina Region board meeting) August 21 board meeting not held for lack of a quorum. Present were RE Andlee Phengphachanh, Rocky Entriken, Phelan Gagnon, Mason Libby and Artt Mann. Also Tyler Colgren, president of Powercat Motorsports (Formula SAE team at Kansas State University).

In informal discussion, Colgren made arrangements to borrow Salina Region equipment for their Formula Wheat FSAE competition Oct. 4-5 at Tuttle Creek State Park, and also provided information on the K-State club's use of the spillway pavement at the park.

Also discussed was the Sunflower Showdown event Aug. 17 (only three Wichita region-of-record members attended, all of whom are also Salina Region members and regular participants in Salina events); an intent to add a statement to event notices on MotorsportsReg.com that a minimum entry of 24 drivers was needed, or the event may be subject to options of using a smaller course or even cancellation; Artt plans to provide barbecue lunch at Octoberfast (Oct. 12) for a \$10 donation to be added to the region's trailer fund, the option to be included in the MotorsportsReg.com listing. -Rocky Entriken.

SUNFLOWER SOLO SHOWDOWN 25.1

The eleventh renewal of the Sunflower Solo Showdown was Wichita Region's Sunday event at their Road Yoder site. Thirty-seven drivers took on a course filled with several sweeping switchbacks. Officially Salina had five drivers competing, but that doesn't include six more who are members of both regions but whose region of record is Wichita, so their scores went into Wichita's 26-driver count. Everyone got five runs.

At the end of the day, matching the average PAX score of each region, Salina is 0.791 sec ahead going into the Aug. 17 round at our Berkley Family Recreation Area.

Four classes filled with four drivers each, but it was the all-Miata E Street that had its drivers on edge. It was the closest class of the day, Rocky Entriken's 52.821 outrunning Jason Rash by 0.194 sec, both scoring for Salina, but Wichita drivers David Grieve and Henry Brillhart were also in the fight, last place only 0.956 sec behind the winning time.

Steven Allen M3 won the 3-car BST class with FTD of 48.744, but that was only 0.615 quicker than Nathan Burris in a 370Z. One step down in CST it was Alex Redman just 0.677 quicker than his co-driver Bret Vaughn, sharing a Toyota MR2 Spyder.

A couple of fast ladies also caught the spotlight. Second-quick overall (48.804) and scoring Top PAX was Laney Blume's Civic Si in GSL, faster than all the GS class, while Sharon Brillhart was quicker than the whole ES class in winning ESL.

Allen and Blume were only drivers in the 48-sec range. Nine more were in the 49s starting with Jim Monroe's 49.0 to win DS in his Toyota GR86.

It's been a hot summer in Kansas this year but relatively speaking Wichita picked a "cool" day for its event. Per the readings at the Hutchinson Municipal Airport, the nearest available, by the time the first heat began the mercury was at 85° and when the event was finished about 1 p.m. it had climbed to 93°. The day's peak was 97° four hours later.

SUNFLOWER SOLO SHOWDOWN 25.2

What happens when you schedule an autocross and only 20 drivers show up? You get more runs. We got seven shots at Andlee Phengphachanh's course for the Salina turn of the Sunflower Solo Showdown. Only 20 drivers. The course was a hoot. It was shorter than usual, about 40 sec, to ensure we had sufficient workers, but the opening was a wide-open throttle run of two sweepers, right and left, each ending with thread-theneedle swipes still no-lift. A quick brake set up the next dash to the turnaround at the dog park, three fast eyebrow slaloms, then a 4-cone slalom to the finish. It was pylon-friendly too, only 25 cones hit all day after 140 runs, but a few DNFs that were mostly a case of overcooking, not course-following.

Despite the small entry we still had sone tight contests. Start with FTD, where BS winner Mason Libby posted a string of sub-40 runs, fastest being a 37.121 on run #4. He had two in the 36-sec range but coned them both. Meanwhile, XA winner Benjamin Hanke driving a VW GTI was putting up 39s and 38s, rolling to the line for his final shot more than a second off the pace. But he lit up the clock with a 37.007, setting FTD by a 0.114 sec margin.

Libby's time still held up for Top PAX. Sharon Brillhart was Fast Lady.

Familiar faces dueled in H Street, Dennis Smith and Don Herrick starting out with 41 sec times and skimming time off each run. By Run #5 Don had a lead at 40.122, but Dennis came back on his #6 run to post 40.100, winning by 0.022 sec.

E Street was a battle also. Rocky Entriken led through the first three runs, posting 40.020 on his third try, but then got wild and DNF'd two of his final four. Meanwhile Jason Rash steadily shaved time each run, turning 39s on his last three runs with a best of 39.356, class winner by 0.664 sec.



National membership includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record. Normally your RoR is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points and participating in their programs. These are "Associate" or "Dual Region" memberships. Salina Region's Associate Members are fully-vested members eligible for all our championships, voting rights, region offices and other member benefits. "Associate" membership only means region-of-record is elsewhere.

You <u>must</u> be a member to enter SCCA events. There are several different types of membership available, including Regular, Family, First Gear (under 25) and Military, plus short-term Trial (free) and Weekend (\$15) Memberships. Questions? • • • Associate memberships • • •

- Associate Memberships in Salina Region expire concurrent with National and Region-of-Record memberships. All Associate memberships paid direct to Salina Region are notified to SCCA Membership and expire on their National expiration date. Associate members are fully-vested members of Salina Region, although their Region-of-Record is elsewhere.
- Annual dues are \$15.00 both for single memberships and for family memberships (which includes spouse and children age 20 and younger).
- To become an Associate Member of Salina Region, contact SCCA Membership (call 1-800-770-2055) and ask to be included as a member in Salina Region. The Region's dues will be paid at that time and added to your renewal fees.
- Or, at renewal time, renew online and you will find an option to "Add Region." Scroll down to find Salina Region in the drop-down menu.
- If you choose to pay dues direct to Salina Region (for example, at an event), we will notify SCCA and your Salina Region membership will become part of your National membership renewal.
- Mailed subscriptions are available to non-members, \$15 for the calendar year.
